

# *The Princess Jar Pattern*

*Created by*





You will need the following:

- Three different colors of yarn (4ply)
- Size 3mm hook
- Yarn needle
- Scissors
- Jar (circ 23cm, height for this pattern is 12cm)

Stitches and abbreviations used in this pattern US: (\* will be explained)

sl st – slipstitch

ch – chain

sc – single crochet

hdc – half double crochet

dc – double crochet

tr – treble crochet

picot \*

tr2tog – treble crochet two together \*

dc2tog – double crochet two together \*

rep - repeat

## Special stitches

### tr2tog – treble crochet two together

Make a treble crochet but do not complete it, instead leave two loops on your hook.



Then make the second treble crochet and, again, do not complete it. You should have three loops on your hook.



Now yarn over and pull through all three loops at the same time. This way you will crochet two treble crochets together and end up with one and not two countable stitches



### **dc2tog – double crochet two together**

Same technique as with the tr2tog, see pics above, but with a double crochet instead of a treble. There is an extra pic explaining the positioning of the closer in the pattern.

### **Picot**

In this pattern the picot stitch is used right at the end in the final row. This is how you do make this stitch:

Chain 1 on top of the double crochet you just made



Now take your hook through the two top front loops on the double crochet you just made.



Now make your slipstitch by pulling yarn through the now three loops on your hook



## Other helpful tips

When I cut and fasten yarn I don't use a slipstitch, I make an invisible fasten-off. This is also why I do a chain 2 instead of a chain 3 to act as a double crochet in the beginning of a round. I'm hoping that the next few pics will be helpful.



Take your hook off the loop and cut yarn.  
Pull the yarn through the stitch you just made.



My needle is showing which stitch you want to pull your yarn through. If you look carefully you can see that this is the stitch above your chain 2. Just to the left you see the dc stitch. In this example I have done a dc and ch1 the whole round (like in round 2 of this pattern) so I want there to be a chain between my two dc in the pic.



Here the yarn has been pulled through.



Here I am trying to show with my needle where you want to go next, back into the chain 1 where you came from. The loop you are making with your needle will act like the stitch on top of your dc made out of the chain 2 you started off with.



Here the yarn has been pulled through and then pulled tight.



As you can see it is almost impossible to see where you have fastened-off or in this case where you started the round.  
And if you look closely and zoom in, you can count the stitches and see that it is the same for the whole round.

I hope this was helpful!

## Notes on the Pattern

- I've used a cotton 4ply yarn (Scheepjes Catona) and a 3mm hook. This pattern is crocheted from the bottom up, not the other way around like many other jar patterns. So some pulling and stretching to get the jar in might be needed, but I wanted to be able to take the finished product of the jar and also I didn't want to have to crochet around the jar.

- The circumference of the jar is more important for the pattern than the height as you can add rows to fit higher jars.

- If you have a taller jar you can add rounds 10, 11 and 12 after you have completed round 12. For instance I've made one that is 15 cm and by adding these three rounds again it was covered. With only this change made in round 10:

### **[Round 10 (A)**

Ch2 (counts as dc) \* 3dc in the ch3 space, dc in the next dc rep from\* the whole round, sl st in dc stitch to make the ch2 into a dc (56dc)]

- Next to each round you will find what yarn color to use. In this pattern colors are named A, B or C.

- You can crochet the pattern without a color change, however you might find it easier to still cut the yarn after rounds 13 and 15 so you avoid slip-stitching your way to the starting point of the next round. This in round 8 will help if you don't cut the yarn in round 7, but you need to cut the yarn after round 8. You do not need to cut yarn after round 20, just sl st twice to get to the top of the little loop.

### **[Round 8:2 (A – The Princess Jar without a color-change)**

Ch1 (acts as a sc) 3sc, (hdc, 5dc, hdc in ch4-loop), \*7sc, (hdc, 5dc, hdc in ch4-loop) rep from\* for the whole round, 3sc, sl st in 1<sup>st</sup> ch.

Cut yarn and fasten in first sl st  
(7 petals and 7sc in between)]

- Take special note in round 14 and round 21 that you start in the right little loop. In round 14 you want the middle of the fan you're making to be in between the petals in color B from round 8 so you want to start off in a little

loop above the middle of a petal. Round 21 you want to start off in the same way you did in round 8.

Position for starting round 14:



- Round 16 has an extra pic explaining the positioning of the dc2tog.

# *The Princess Jar Pattern*

## **Round 1 (A)**

With yarn A make a magic circle and ch2 (counts as dc), work 13dc into the ring, sl st in the top of beg ch2. Pull on your magic ring to close it (14dc)

## **Round 2 (A)**

Ch3 (2counts as 1dc), \*dc in next dc, ch1, rep from\* for the whole round, sl st in 3<sup>rd</sup> ch. (14dc, 14 ch1-spaces = 28)

## **Round 3 (A)**

1ch, 28sc, sl st in ch (28)

## **Round 4 (A)**

Ch5 (first 2 counts as dc), skip 1sc, \*1dc, ch3, skip sc rep from\* for the whole round, sl st in 3<sup>rd</sup> ch. (14dc and 14 ch3 spaces)

## **Round 5 (A)**

\*Ch9, sl st in 2<sup>nd</sup> dc rep from\* 6 times. 7<sup>th</sup> time sl st in original sl st. (7 ch9-spaces)



## **Round 6 (A)**

Ch5 (first 2ch counts as dc), \* 2sc in the middle of ch9 space, ch3, dc in sl st, ch3 rep from\* 6 times, ch3, sl st in 3<sup>rd</sup>ch (14 ch3-spaces)

**Round 7 (A)** *see pic below*

Ch1, \*2sc in 3ch space, sc in sc, ch4, sc in sc, 2sc in 3ch space, 1sc in dc, rep from\* for the whole round (7 ch4-loops, 7sc in between the loops)

Cut yarn and fasten



**Round 8 (B)**

Sl st in a sc before a ch4-loop, \* (hdc, 5dc, hdc in ch4-loop), 7sc rep from\* for the whole round.

Cut yarn and fasten in first sl st  
(7 petals and 7sc in between)

**Round 9 (A)**

\*Sl st in 3<sup>rd</sup> dc in a petal, ch3, tr2tog in 1<sup>st</sup> and 7<sup>th</sup> sc, ch3 rep from\* for the whole round. Sl st in original sl st. (14 ch3-spaces)

**Round 10 (A)**

Ch2 (counts as dc) \* 3dc in the ch3 space, dc in the tr2tog, 3dc in the ch3 space, dc in the sl st on the petal and rep from\* sl st in first dc making the ch2 into a dc (56dc)

**Round 11 (A)**

Ch3 (2 counts as dc) \*skip sc, dc in next sc, ch1 rep from\* for the whole round, sl st in 3<sup>rd</sup> ch (28 ch-spaces)

**Round 12 (A)**

Ch5 (2 counts as dc) \*skip dc, dc in dc, ch3 rep from\* for the whole round, sl st in 3<sup>rd</sup> ch (14 ch-spaces)

**Round 13 (A)**

Ch4 (1ch acts as a sc) sc in same stitch, \*ch2, in next dc (sc, ch3, sc) rep from\* for the whole round

Cut yarn and fasten in 1<sup>st</sup> ch  
(14 little loops and 14 ch2-spaces)

**Round 14 (C)**

\*Sl st in little loop (one above mid of a petal), 8tr in next little loop rep from\* for the whole round. Sl st in original sl st (7 big fans)

**Round 15 (C) see pic below**

Ch1 (acts like a sc) \*ch4, 1sc in 4<sup>th</sup> tr, ch3, 1sc in 5<sup>th</sup> tr, ch4, sc in sl st rep from\* for the whole round. (14 ch4-spaces, 7 ch3-loops)

Cut yarn and fasten



**Round 16 (A) see pic below**

Sl st in ch3 loop, ch1 (acts as a sc) \*ch3, **dc2tog in both ch3-spaces**, ch3, sc in next ch3 loop rep from\* for the rest of the round. Sl st in 1<sup>st</sup> ch. (14 ch3-spaces)



**The dc2tog pulls the two ch3-spaces next to each other, from previous round, towards each other.**

**Round 17 (A)**

Rep round 10 (56dc)

**Round 18 (A)**

Rep round 11 (28 ch spaces)

**Round 19 (A)**

Ch4 (2ch counts as dc) \*dc in 2<sup>nd</sup> dc, ch2 rep from\* for the whole round, sl st in 3<sup>rd</sup> ch (14 ch2 spaces)

**Round 20 (A)**

Ch4 (1ch acts as a sc) sc in same stitch, \*ch1, in next dc (sc, ch3, sc) rep from\* for the whole round

Cut yarn and fasten

(14 little loops and 14 ch spaces)

**Round 21 (B)**

\*Sl st in little loop, 9dc in next little loop with picot on the 5<sup>th</sup> dc rep from\* for the whole round.

Cut yarn and fasten

(7 pointy petals)

*Finished*
